

Course Title: Advanced Ṣadrīan Philosophy: The Bidāyat al-Ḥikma of ʿAllāmah

Module Title: Quiddity and Causation (Part 2 of 4)

Module Code: PHIBID2

Course Duration: 17 weeks (2 units per week)

Assessment: 90% end of semester exam; 10% attendance and class participation

Module Description:

This modules focusses on two main themes: (1) the metaphysics of causation and (2) the philosophical study of the concept of quiddity ($m\bar{a}hiyya$). In the first part of this module students are introduced to the concept of modality and its relation to the essence-existence distinction, and how, by a focus on the notion of composition, it is possible to show that essence and existence must be identical in the Necessary Being. Several lessons will be devoted to the concepts of necessity and possibility, and their various characteristics. In particular, students will be taken through a series of metaphysical considerations about the nature of possibility and role it has in the metaphysics of causation. Part 2 of this module is given over entirely to the concept of quiddity, its considerations, the concepts of what is essential and accidental to a quiddity, and the means by which a quiddity is individuated in extramental existence.
